Mold growth may also cause structural damage to the property. 164. Therefore, it is very important to detect and remediate water intrusion problems. 165. Fungi are present everywhere in our environment, both indoors and outdoors. Many molds are beneficial to humans. 166. However, molds have the ability to produce mycotoxins that may have a potential to cause serious health problems, 167. particularly in some immunocompromised individuals and people who have asthma or allergies to mold. 168. To complicate matters, mold growth is often difficult to detect, as it frequently grows within the wall structure. If you 169. have a concern about water intrusion or the resulting mold/mildew/fungi growth, you may want to consider having 170. the property inspected for moisture problems before entering into a purchase agreement or as a condition of your 171. purchase agreement. Such an analysis is particularly advisable if you observe staining or any musty odors on the 172. 173. property. Radon in Real Estate Transactions

All Minnesota homes can have dangerous levels of radon gas. Radon is a colorless, odorless and tasteless radioactive gas that can seep into homes from the soil. When inhaled, it can damage the lungs. Long-term exposure to radon can lead to lung cancer. About 21,000 lung cancer deaths each year in the United States are caused by radon.

The only way to know how much radon gas has entered the home is to conduct a radon test. MDH estimates 2 in 5 homes exceed the 4.0 pCi/L action level. Whether a home is old or new, any home can have high levels of radon.

The purpose of this publication is to educate and inform potential home buyers of the risks of radon exposure, and how to test for and reduce radon as part of real estate transactions.

Disclosure Requirements



Effective January 1, 2014, the Minnesota Radon Awareness Act requires specific disclosure and education be provided to potential home buyers during residential real estate transactions in Minnesota. Before signing a purchase agreement to sell or transfer residential real property, the seller shall provide this publication and shall disclose in writing to the buyer:

- 1. whether a radon test or tests have occurred on the property;
- the most current records and reports pertaining to radon concentrations within the dwelling;
- 3. a description of any radon levels, mitigation, or remediation;
- 4. information on the radon mitigation system, if a system was installed; and
- 5. a radon warning statement.

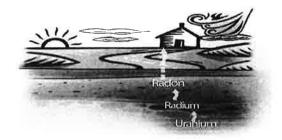


Radon Facts

How dangerous is radon? Radon is the number one cause of lung cancer in non-smokers, and the second leading cause overall. Your risk for lung cancer increases with higher levels of radon, prolonged exposure, and whether or not you are a current smoker or former smoker.

Where is your greatest exposure to radon? For most Minnesotans, your greatest exposure is at home where radon can concentrate indoors.

What is the recommended action based on my results? If the average radon in the home is at or above 4.0 pCi/L, the home's radon level should be reduced. Also, consider mitigating if radon levels are between 2.0 pCi/L and 3.9 pCi/L. Any amount of radon, even below the recommended action level, carries some risk.

Radon Testing

Any test lasting less than three months requires closed-house conditions. Keep all windows and doors closed, except for normal entry and exit.

Before testing: Begin closed-house conditions at least 12 hours before the start of the radon test.

During testing: Maintain closed-house conditions during the entire duration of the short-term test. Operate home heating or cooling systems normally during the test. Test for at least 48 hours.

Where should the test be conducted? Any radon test conducted for a real estate transaction needs to be placed in the lowest livable area of the home suitable for occupancy. This is typically in the basement, whether finished or unfinished.

Place the test kit:

- twenty inches to six feet above the floor
- at least three feet from exterior walls
- · four inches away from other objects
- in a location where it won't be disturbed
- not in enclosed areas or areas of high heat or humidity

How are radon tests conducted in real estate transactions? There are special protocols for radon testing. The two most common ways to test are either using a calibrated continuous radon monitor (CRM) or two-short term test kits used at the same time. The short-term test kits are placed 4 inches apart and the results are averaged.

All radon tests should be conducted by a certified professional. This ensures the test was conducted properly, in the correct location, and under appropriate building conditions. A list of these radon measurement professionals can be found at MDH's Radon website. If the seller previously conducted testing in a property at or above 4 pCi/L, the home should be mitigated.

Radon Mitigation

When elevated levels of radon are found, they can be easily reduced by a certified radon mitigation professional.

Radon mitigation is the process used to reduce radon concentrations in buildings. This is done by drawing soil gas from under the house and venting it above the roof. A quality mitigation system should reduce levels to below 4.0 pCi/L, if not lower.

After a radon mitigation system is installed perform an independent short-term test to ensure the reduction system is effective. Operate the radon system during the entire test. This test will confirm low levels in the home. Be sure to retest the house every two years to confirm continued radon reduction.

Radon Warning Statement

"The Minnesota Department of Health strongly recommends that ALL homebuyers have an indoor radon test performed prior to purchase or taking occupancy, and recommends having the radon levels mitigated if elevated radon concentrations are found. Elevated radon concentrations can easily be reduced by a qualified, certified, or licensed, if applicable, radon mitigator.

Every buyer of any interest in residential real property is notified that the property may present exposure to dangerous levels of indoor radon gas that may place the occupants at risk of developing radon-induced lung cancer. Radon, a Class A human carcinogen, is the leading cause of lung cancer in nonsmokers and the second leading cause overall. The seller of any interest in residential real property is required to provide the buyer with any information on radon test results of the dwelling".

WATER WELL: A water well is any type of well used to extract groundwater for private or public use. Examples 91. 92. of water wells are: domestic wells, drive-point wells, dug wells, remedial wells, and municipal wells. IRRIGATION WELL: An irrigation well is a well used to irrigate agricultural lands. These are typically 93. large-diameter wells connected to a large pressure distribution system. 94. 95. MONITORING WELL: A monitoring well is a well used to monitor groundwater contamination. The well is 96. typically used to access groundwater for the extraction of samples. 97. DEWATERING WELL: A dewatering well is a well used to lower groundwater levels to allow for construction 98. or use of underground spaces. 99. INDUSTRIAL/COMMERCIAL WELL: An industrial/commercial well is a nonpotable well used to extract 100. groundwater for any nonpotable use, including groundwater thermal exchange wells (heat pumps and heat 101. loops). 102. WELL USE STATUS: Indicate the use status of each well. CHECK ONLY ONE (1) BOX PER WELL. IN USE: A well is "in use" if the well is operated on a daily, regular, or seasonal basis. A well in use includes 103. a well that operates for the purpose of irrigation, fire protection, or emergency pumping. 104. 105. NOT IN USE: A well is "not in use" if the well does not meet the definition of "in use" above and has not been 106. sealed by a licensed well contractor. SEALED: A well is "sealed" if a licensed contractor has completely filled a well by pumping grout material 107. throughout the entire bore hole after removal of any obstructions from the well. A well is "capped" if it has 108. a metal or plastic cap or cover which is threaded, bolted or welded into the top of the well to prevent entry 109. 110. into the well. A "capped" well is not a "sealed" well. 111. If the well has been sealed by someone other than a licensed well contractor or a licensed well sealing 112. contractor, check the well status as "not in use." 113.
