Radon: Real Estate Transactions



All Minnesota homes can heve dengerous levels of **ration gas** in them. Redon is a colorless, odorless and tasteless **radioactive gas** that can seep into homes from the earth. When inheled, its radioactive particles can damage the cells that line the lungs. Long-term exposure to radon can lead to **fining causer.** About 21,000 lung center deaths each year in the United States are caused by radon, making it a serious health concern for all Minnesotans.

It does not matter if the home is old or now and the only way to know how much radon gas has entered the home is to conduct a radon test. MDH estimates 2 in 5 homes hulk hefere 2010 and 1 in 5 homes bulk since 2010 exceed the 4,0 pC/L action level.



In Minnesota, buyers and sallers in a real estate transaction are free to negotiate radon tasting and reduction. Ultimately, it is up to the buyer to decide an acceptable level of radon risk in the home, Prospective buyers should keep in mind that it is inexpensive end easy to measure radon, and radon levels can be lowered at a reasonable cost. The MDH Radon Program website provides more detailed information on radon, including the MDH brochure "Keeping Your Home Safe from Radon."

The Minnesota Radon Awareness Act does not require radon testing or mitigation. However, many relocation companies and lending institutions, as well as home buyers, require a radon test when purchasing a house. The purpose of this publication is to educate and inform potential home buyers of the risks of radon exposure, and how to test for and reduce radon as part of real estate transactions.



Disclosure Requirements

Effective January 1, 2014, the Minnesote Redon Awareness Act requires specific disclosure and education be provided to potential home buyers during residential real eatate transactions in Minnesote. This publication is being provided by the sellar in order to meet a requirement of the Act. In addition, instere algoing a prochase agreement at the Act. - 1. whether a radon test or tests have occurred on the property;
- the most current records and reports pertaining to redon concentrations within the dwalling;
- a description of any radon concentrations, mitigation, or remediation;
- information regarding the radon mitigation system, including system description and documentation, if such system has been installed in the dwelling; and
- 5. a radon warning statement

Radon Warning Statement

"The Minnesota Department of Health strongly recommends that ALL homebuyers have an indoor redon test performed prior to purchase or taking occupancy, and recommends having the redon levels mitigated if elevated redon concentrations are found. Elevated redon concentrations can easily be reduced by a qualified, certified, or licensed, if applicable, redon mitigator.

Every buyer of any interest in residential real property is notified that the property may present exposure to dangerous levels of indoor redon gas that may place the cooupents at risk of developing redoninduced lung cencer. Redon, a Class A human carcinogen, is the leading cause of lung cencer in nonemolære and the second leading cause overall. The seller of any interest in residential real property is required to provide the buyer with any information on radon test results of the dwelling.

Consider fixing the home if radon levels are between 2 pCi/l, and 3.9 pCi/l. While it isn't possible to reduce radon to zero, the best approach is to reduce the radon levels to as low as researchly achievable. Any amount of radon, even below the recommended action level, carries some risk.

Radon Testing

House conditions when testing

Be aware that any test leating less than three months requires closed-house conditions.

Closed-house Conditions: Mean keeping all windows and doors closed, except for normal entry and exit.

Befure Testing: Begin closed-house conditions at least 12 hours befure the start of the radon test.

Puring Tunting: Meintain closed-house conditions during the exite duration of the short term test.

Operate home heating or cooling systems normally during the test.

Where the test should be conducted

Any redon test conducted for a real estate transaction needs to be placed in the lowest liveble area of the home suitable for occupancy. In Minnesote, this is typically in the besement, whether it is finished or infinished.

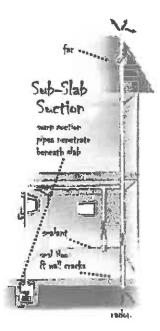
The test kit should be placed:

- . two to elx feet above the floor
- at least three feet from exterior walls
- · four inches eway from other objects
- in a location where it won't be disturbed
- e not in enclosed areas
- not in areas of high heat or humidity

If the house has multiple foundation types, it is recommended that each of these he tested. For instance, if the house has one or more of the following foundation types—besement, crewl space, slab-ongrade—e test should be performed in the besement and in at least one room over the crawlspace and one room with a slab-on-grade area.

Who should conduct radon testing in real estate transactions?

All redon tasts should be conducted in accordance with national radon measurement protocols, by a cartified end MDH-listed professional. This ensures the test was conducted properly, in the correct location, and under appropriate building conditions. A list of these radon measurement professionals can be found at MDH's Radon was site. A seller may have previously conducted testing in a property, if the test result is at or above the action level, the home should be mitigated.



Radon Mitigation

When elevated levels of radon are found, they should be initigated. Envated radon concentrations can be easily reduced by a nationally certified and MDH-listed radon mitigation professional. A list of these radon mitigation professionals can be found at MDH's Radon wab

Radon mitigation is the process or system used to reduce radon concentrations in the breathing zones of occupied buildings. The goal of a radon mitigation system is to reduce the indoor radon levels to below the EPA action level of 4.0 pC/L. A quality radon reduction (mitigation) system is often able to radius the annual everage radon level to below 2.0 pC/L.

Active sub-slab suction (also called sub-slab depressurization, or SED) is the most common and usually the most reliable type of system because it draws radon-filled air from benesth the house and vents it outside. There are standards of practics that need to be followed for the installation of these systems. More information on radon mitigation can be found at the MDH Radon website.

Perform an independent short-term test to ensure that the reduction system is effective. Make sure the reduction system is operating during the entire test. Once a confirmatory radon test shows low levels of radon in the home, be sure to retest the house every two years to confirm continued radon reduction.
